A recent UN Secretary General Policy Brief, "Transforming Extractive Industries for sustainable development" focuses on how the sector can become an engine to support a just transition to a net zero, circular, and inclusive global economy and discusses needs and challenges. This is a response to a call for a more sustainable, resilient, and inclusive future, where those countries rich in the materials needed for a green transition can capitalize to achieve economic, environmental, and social benefits.
