Countries are increasingly using their NAP processes to realize gender-responsive climate action and act on the Gender Action Plan (GAP) under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.

Since 2017, we have partnered with governments in 13 countries to support the integration of gender considerations in their NAP processes. At the same time, we share learning and synthesize progress in integrating gender in NAP processes.

In the **Republic of the Marshall Islands**, the gender and human rights analysis is an important basis for developing their NAP document.
